The speaker concludes by emphasizing the role of educators in cultivating critical thinking and awareness while acknowledging the risks involved in challenging the prevalent neoliberal narrative. They advocate for working within the "cracks" of the neoliberal system to promote change and foster awareness of inequalities, ultimately encouraging the development of alternate visions for a more just world.
