This video video discusses the evolving perspectives of young American Jews regarding their relationship with Israel and Palestine, focusing on how this shift is influencing Jewish identity and activism. The author shares their motivation for writing a book that explores these changing attitudes, particularly among younger generations who are increasingly engaging in Palestine solidarity activism.

Key themes include a recognition of a generational divide in support for Israel, the impact of Palestine solidarity activism as an expression of Jewish identity, and the need for a nuanced conversation within Jewish communities about the state of Israel. - 3. **Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions (BDS)**: Activists engage in campaigns to apply economic pressure on institutions profiting from the occupation, despite the controversy surrounding BDS within the Jewish community.

The author argues that such activism is a valid expression of Jewishness and underscores the interconnectedness of Jewish and Palestinian liberation.
