The researchers are interested in how the home ownership status of politicians affects their policy choices, particularly in terms of addressing the needs of renters versus homeowners. They highlight that over 80% of politicians at various levels of government are property owners, which creates a disparity in representation, especially in cities where renters comprise the majority. The study emphasizes that understanding politicians' demographic backgrounds might help explain why public policy often favors homeowners. They are exploring when policymakers prioritize renters' interests and the impact of increased renter representation on housing policy. The research involved collecting data on over 10,000 politicians and their property records, which was analyzed to reveal significant disparities in homeownership among elected officials. The authors aim to investigate how these factors influence housing policy in the context of a nationwide housing crisis.
